Five female artists who studied together in Edinburgh and now reside, or have grown up in Glasgow will collectively curate an interdisciplinary creative space in the centre of Glasgow as part of the Glasgow International 2018

The Artists have developed an event which aims to utilise the philosophy of promoting locally led initiatives, which empower local people and which focus on sustainability, environmental awareness and creativity.

The Artists will use resources supplied by Glasgow the Caring City charity, reinventing and recycling these materials which have been made for various public events and collected from private clearances. The group aim to reimagine a industrial space, creating an immersive environment that will showcase sculpture, video and photography within the installation. There will also be a programme of workshops for young adults and children, including live digital drawing, interactive touch murals, collage and sculpture making.

On the opening preview night there will be a one off guest performance from Sarah Tanant Jones who performs as tanat, builds layers of harmony and percussions into energetic, electronic dance songs, influenced by Rio Carnival Rhythms and Eastern European Choral styles, each performance is unique, built upon loops and layers of energy and instrumentation.

LOUISE GIBSON 1985

Originating from Scotland, Gibson graduated from Edinburgh College of Art in 2009 and in 2013 relocated the studio to Berlin. In 2014 she was granted a long term private residency placement on a metal recycling yard on the outskirts of the city in Lichtenberg where one of her studios is based. Gibson is currently living in Glasgow where she is making a body of new work and pursuing a research project in collaboration with her sponsors Polynt Composites (Grimsby) and ASCUS Art and science (Edinburgh). Gibson predominantly combines polyester resins with recycled fabrics, using various practical processes to complete work, sculpting casts at marble factories, moulding metals with onsite metal recycling machinery and lacquering art works at local car garages.

Gibson's practice and innovative work with resins is sponsored and supported by global resin manufacturer Polynt composites.

Travel sketchbooks and personal diaries play an important role in Ursula's image making process, with an ongoing pursuit to find innovative ways to depict her experiences through her illustration work.

Broad influences from street art, folkloric history, music, ancient relics, religious artworks, childhood memories spent in Hong Kong, escapist American television and Asian comics all collide into two-dimensional line work that presents a conversation on the hyper-real future, social ideals and expectations of the female individual. In an age of digital culture and information overload, Ursula's work harnesses the power of the hyperactive mind.
